This past Monday, I celebrated 30 years of priesthood. Normally I am on retreat during the week of my anniversary. This year I will make retreat later in the summer due to a scheduling conflict with a wedding I promised to do. It was great to be home and have many thoughtful remembrances of my ordination.

Thirty years is a long time and yet it seems to have slipped by. I think that is a sign that the ministry has been enjoyable and fulfilling. It is also probably a sign of age. In any event it has gone by rapidly and it has been a wonderful journey. Through the years there have been many good and faithful parishioners in the parishes that I have served who have revealed to me the goodness of our God. I have also been blessed to work with many fine priests and deacons in these past thirty years. Some of those men who shared ministry with me have since been released into the embrace of God's eternal love. Some are still working side by side with me laboring in the vineyard. There are also some of my brother priests who have retired from active ministry. Generally that means they are as busy as they have been doing other things and hopefully enjoying some much deserved rest. It is these retired brothers that are the focus of my remaining remarks on this cover.

Currently we have ten priests who are retired. Most live in the diocese and a couple are in other parts of the country. Over the years we have worked hard as a diocese to ensure that they have an adequate retirement. We continue to work at that as costs go up and investments remain somewhat precarious. It is worth the continuing effort since these brothers have been faithful servants of the Lord in our diocese for many years.

When priests retire they continue to receive their full salary. However, unlike active ministry, the retired priests are responsible for their board and room. Most priests therefore depend on Social Security and retirement savings they have been able to create for themselves.

The priest's salary is paid out of the Priest's Retirement Aid Association or PRAA. This association also pays the health insurance premiums for the retired priests. PRAA has an endowment that has grown over the years thanks to the people of our diocese. There are two primary sources of funding. One is an annual assessment that each parish pays to the association and the other is gifts and free will offerings.

The assessment is determined in part according to the number of priests living and working in the parish. Each priest gets a set amount from the parish which is paid to PRAA. In addition, each parish is assessed an additional amount according to their ability to generate income. The level of the assessment is set by the diocese in consultation with the PRAA board and other advisory bodies of the diocese. In the past few years it has increased to ensure that we will have adequate funds to support retired priests for years to come.

The free will offerings that come to PRAA are the result of bequests and donations. Each year in the diocese we have a collection to support PRAA. This free will offering will be taken up next weekend here at the Cathedral. The envelope is in this week's bulletin.

I hope you will consider giving to this collection. It is one way to express gratitude for the ministry of the priests of our diocese and tell them that their years of service have been a blessing to the diocese. I would also encourage you to pray for the retired and active priests (as we did this last week during the priests' retreat). As someone who has lived this vocation from the inside, I can assure you that the priests of our diocese very much desire to serve God's people. Your continued support is really important. Knowing that you care about us increases our desire to minister for you and with you. Thanks for these past wonderful and challenging thirty years.


THANK YOU

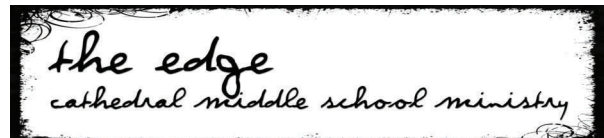

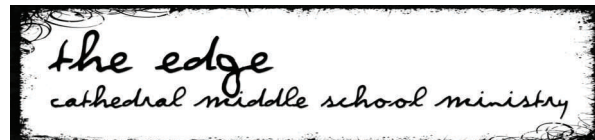

YEAR FOR PRIESTS

Pope Benedict XVI has announced a "Year for Priests" beginning June 19, 2009, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the celebration of the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. This year will also mark the 150th anniversary of the death of the saintly Curé of Ars, St. John Mary Vianney, the patron of priests. This is a year for the Church to witness to all that "she is proud of her priests, loves them, honors them, admires them and that she recognizes with gratitude their pastoral work and the witness of their life" (Letter for Year for Priests, Cláudio Cardinal Hummes, prefect of the Congregation for the Clergy). It is a year to encourage priests in their spiritual growth and to pray for them. The Congregation for the Clergy has also recommended Eucharistic adoration for the sanctification of priests throughout this year. The Vatican has also offered a plenary indulgence for all the faithful on the occasion of the Year for Priests, the details of which are below. *Please pray for our priests! Let us especially remember them on June 19, the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests.*

The Vatican has announced a plenary indulgence for all the faithful on the occasion of the Year for Priests. For priests, the plenary indulgence can be gained by praying lauds or vespers before the Blessed Sacrament exposed or in the tabernacle. They must also "offer themselves with a ready and generous heart for the celebration of the sacraments, especially the sacrament of penance." This must be accompanied by sacramental confession, Communion, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. Priests are granted a partial indulgence every time they "devotedly recited the prayers duly approved to lead a saintly life and to carry out the duties entrusted to them." These can also be applied to deceased priests. The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence on the opening and closing days of the Year for Priests, on the 150th anniversary of the death of St. John Mary Vianney, on the first Thursday of the month, or on any other day established by the ordinaries of particular places for the good of the faithful. To obtain the indulgence they must attend Mass in an oratory or Church and offer prayers to "Jesus Christ, supreme and eternal Priest, for the priests of the church, or perform any good work to sanctify and mould them to his heart." The usual conditions for a plenary indulgence also apply. The homebound may also obtain the plenary indulgence if, with the intention of observing the usual three conditions as soon as they can, "on the days concerned, they pray for the sanctification of priests and offer their sickness and suffering to God through Mary, Queen of the Apostles." The faithful may obtain a partial indulgence when they repeat the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be, five times, or any other duly approved prayer "in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to ask that priests maintain purity and sanctity of life."
