It is interesting to write a cover for the bulletin about an event happening the weekend you are reading this. So...Sunday (tomorrow if you are reading this Saturday night or today if you are reading this on Sunday) we are having (or did have if you are reading this on Sunday after the 10:30 AM or 5:30 PM Mass) a reception to say farewell to Father Gary Oreshoski as he moves to Presho and its missions and farewell to Deacon George Gladfelter as he enters retirement. Both men have served the Cathedral faithfully and they are deserving of our time and attention as they move forward in their vocations.

Father Gary was a young pilot at Ellsworth AFB and a member of the Cathedral Parish when he decided that he was called to the priesthood. We are so grateful that he listened and said yes. He has been a faithful priest for our diocese serving the people of Blessed Sacrament, Faith, Bell Fourche, Sturgis and Buffalo and its missions before joining the staff here. His dedication and kindness is a wonderful mark of his priestly service. The staff will miss his daily coffee rounds and wonderful laugh. The hospital staff and patients will miss his vigilant attention and sincere care for them. The RCIA class will miss his direction and guidance and his brother priests at the Cathedral will miss his constant positive response and genuine friendship. All that said, Father Gary will be a wonderful pastor to the people at Presho, Murdo and Draper. Having a farewell reception for him between the 8:00 and 10:30 AM Masses is important to send him off.

Deacon George Gladfelter is retiring from active ministry effective July 1. Although he is not going away and we will still see him with us at the Eucharist, Deacon George is taking a well deserved rest. Since joining the Cathedral Church in 1982, then George Gladfelter has been a faithful servant of God and his Church. He responded to the deaconal call and was ordained in 1990. While working at TECH and later as a staff member here, Deacon George was ready and willing to assist. His ministries have been many and varied. His generosity is

well known and deeply appreciated. The messages of Deacon George's homilies have hit home and caused much reflection. He has baptized babies, prepared couples and witnessed marriages and been the first line of response for those who come to the Cathedral asking for assistance. He has used his computer and photographic skills for many projects at the Cathedral. Simply said, Deacon George has said "yes" to God and to the many requests that have been made of him through the years.

Retirement does not mean that all his ministry stops. We all know the many priests and deacons who retire and remain active. For Deacon George, retirement means that he is no longer "on the schedule." There is no expectation that he will be at a given Mass or class and/or perform some needed ministry. In retirement, when deacons come to celebrate the Eucharist, they are no longer required to step up and assist with Communion as they have in the past. Deacon George will not be on the preaching schedule and will not be assigned to cover baptisms on a given Sunday. Retirement means that he will have the freedom to say yes or no, to offer assistance or not. Due to Deacon George's recent health problems and his age, he will do what he can as his energy and ability dictate. We will still see him at Mass and parish events and from time to time I or some other staff or parishioner might ask his assistance. Deacon will be able to respond as he chooses.

Simply stated, retirement for a deacon mirrors retirement for anyone. There is the freedom of not being tied to a schedule. Although George will always be a deacon, he has permission from the Bishop to lay down the expectation of being present and working in his deaconal ministry.

I hope you will come to the reception (or that you came to the reception). Both of these men deserve our thanks. If you are unable to attend the reception, a note of thanks or a call would also be appreciated.

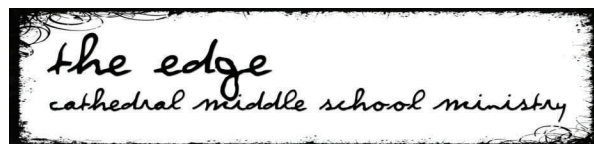

### **YEAR FOR PRIESTS**

Pope Benedict XVI has announced a "Year for Priests" beginning June 19, 2009, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the celebration of the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. This year will also mark the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of the saintly Curé of Ars, St. John Mary Vianney, the patron of priests. This is a year for the Church to witness to all that "she is proud of her priests, loves them, honors them, admires them and that she recognizes with gratitude their pastoral work and the witness of their life" (Letter for Year for Priests, Cláudio Cardinal Hummes, prefect of the Congregation for the Clergy). It is a year to encourage priests in their spiritual growth and to pray for them. The Congregation for the Clergy has also recommended Eucharistic adoration for the sanctification of priests throughout this year. The Vatican has also offered a plenary indulgence for all the faithful on the occasion of the Year for Priests, the details of which are below. *Please pray for our priests!*

The Vatican has announced a plenary indulgence for all the faithful on the occasion of the Year for Priests. For priests, the plenary indulgence can be gained by praying lauds or vespers before the Blessed Sacrament exposed or in the tabernacle. They must also "offer themselves with a ready and generous heart for the celebration of the sacraments, especially the sacrament of penance." This must be accompanied by sacramental confession, Communion, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. Priests are granted a partial indulgence every time they "devotedly recited the prayers duly approved to lead a saintly life and to carry out the duties entrusted to them." These can also be applied to deceased priests. The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence on the opening and closing days of the Year for Priests, on the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of St. John Mary Vianney, on the first Thursday of the month, or on any other day established by the ordinaries of particular places for the good of the faithful. To obtain the indulgence they must attend Mass in an oratory or Church and offer prayers to "Jesus Christ, supreme and eternal Priest, for the priests of the church, or perform any good work to sanctify and mould them to his heart." The usual conditions for a plenary indulgence also apply. The homebound may also obtain the plenary indulgence if, with the intention of observing the usual three conditions as soon as they can, "on the days concerned, they pray for the sanctification of priests and offer their sickness and suffering to God through Mary, Queen of the Apostles." The faithful may obtain a partial indulgence when they repeat the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be, five times, or any other duly approved prayer "in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to ask that priests maintain purity and sanctity of life."
