## July 5, 2009

The Fourth of July is a national holiday but it is not a Church holiday or feast in any way. When the Fourth falls on a weekend it is somewhat awkward to figure out how to recognize this most important day in our national history while maintaining the integrity of the Church vision of liturgy. However, there is a national holiday for which the Church has provided prayer texts. That is Thanksgiving. Since that holiday never falls on a weekend, I thought it would be good to reflect on the preface for Thanksgiving to give us an appreciation of the relationship of our country's history to our beliefs.

The preface is the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer. It changes from week to week and often speaks about the theme or focus of the Mass for that day. Every preface is addressed to God.

In praying the first part of the Thanksgiving Preface we remind God that he created human kind and set men and women over all creation. We then remind God that he chose a people and lead them out of bondage to slavery in Egypt and brought them to a new land where they could live in freedom. The preface continues by stating that this promise of freedom was foretold by the prophets of the Old Testament and fulfilled in Jesus Christ. We tell God that for generation upon generation God has lead people to believe that Jesus gave us a new freedom by his death and resurrection. Then we pray in this Thanksgiving preface:

**It happened to our fathers (and we would add mothers) who came to this land as if out of the desert into a place of promise and hope. It happens to us still, in our time, as you lead all men through your Church to the blessed vision of peace.**

The Church has taken the origins of our country and interpreted them in light of salvation history. The freedom that Jesus won for us is a freedom from sin. Our ancestors came to this land looking for freedom. The freedom they wanted was a freedom from the tyranny of their life situation. That physical oppression is often accompanied by an emotional and spiritual oppression as well. True freedom is freedom from sin and separation from God. The Church sees the struggle of our fore fathers and mothers as a sign of the deeper and more genuine struggle to be free of sin.

The Church also gives an interpretation to our country's mission. The freedom that we hold dear in America is to be used to work toward that true freedom from sin. The freedom we celebrate this holiday is a call to that deep freedom through Jesus Christ and his Church. That freedom is to issue forth in peace for us and for all people. Thus this celebration of our freedom proclaimed on the Fourth of July is seen in light of the more long lasting freedom and peace that comes from God through Jesus Christ.

This holiday we can pause and ask ourselves if we appreciate the freedom that we enjoy living in America; if we appreciate the sacrifices that have been made by so many to ensure that freedom. We can also reflect on the common heritage that we enjoy with all God's people all over the world who have been called to the freedom that transcends politics and country boundaries. Above all, we can ask ourselves if we desire and are willing to sacrifice for not only the freedom that we celebrate on this national holiday but also, and more importantly, the freedom that is eternal.

Enjoy this holiday and thank God for the gift of freedom, God's freedom in Jesus Christ.

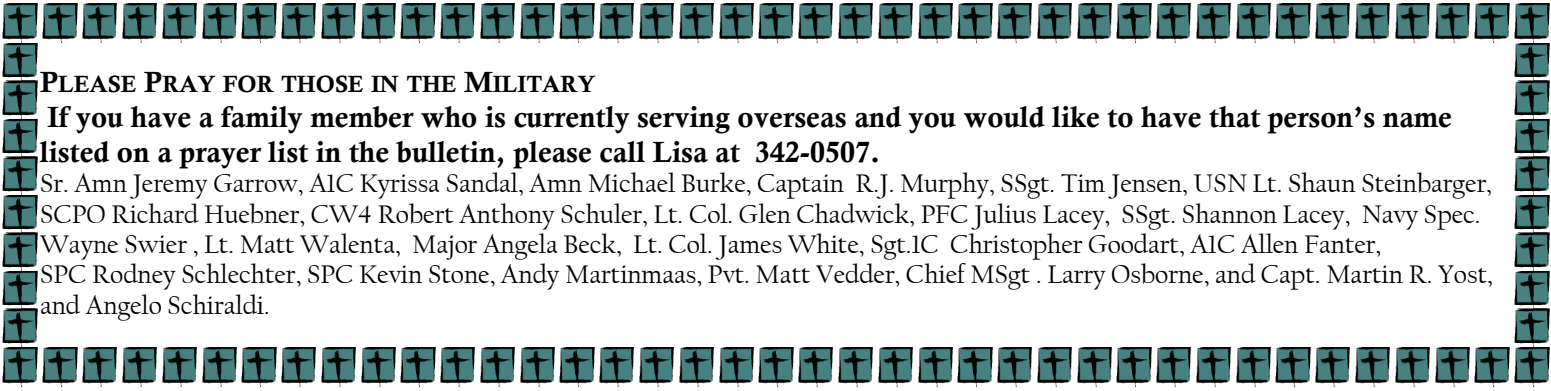

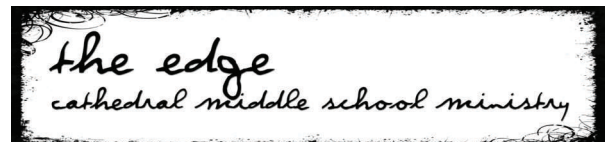
