The Year of the Priest is a wonderful opportunity. On one level it gives the laity an opportunity to be grateful for and thank the priests that work with them. As a recipient of that gratitude I am already humbled by the generosity of my parish family. Events like the week of adoration during priest's retreat and the compliments and kindness shown are gifts without equal or measure.

On another level, this year gives the laity an opportunity to reflect on priesthood as a whole. Through the priesthood the ministry of Jesus is continued. This is especially true in the celebration of the sacraments. Jesus is present and lives in the Church community through the work on the priesthood. The treasure of this presence can not be over-estimated. The nourishing, healing and forgiving Lord is given to all the faithful again and again through the ministry of the priest. This year provides an opportunity to reflect on that blessing and the role of the priest in the ministry of Jesus.

On yet another level, this Year of the Priest calls the faithful to a deeper reflection on their own vocation. The baptized also continue the ministry of Jesus in their lives. They are the co-workers with the priests and in fact, the priest's ministry is pale and ineffective without the side-by-side ministry of the faithful. As precious as the gift of priesthood is it is incomplete without the equally precious gift of the faithful. This year the laity are invited to reflect on their own ministry in light of the priest. Long gone are the days of "father doing it all" or the attitude that "I am not as good or worthy as father." Calling the baptized faithful to active ministry does not diminish the role of the priest but rather heightens it.

We are the Church, head and members, all called and each in our own unique role to fulfill and complete the work of Jesus.

Yet again, this year dedicated to priesthood can also invite the priests themselves to be renewed in their ministry. As "alter Christus" (or other Christ) the priest holds a unique relationship to the Lord. We are called to realize anew the beautiful ministry we have. We are called to deepen our union with the Lord and to offer ourselves in service, imitating the one we are called to make present in the Eucharist and the other sacraments. In the midst of the difficulties we have experienced in the priesthood, this year is a call to manifest the Lord present in ever more vibrant ways. Our weakness given to the Lord can allow the Lord's strength to be manifest in us.

The prayer that we are praying each weekend before Mass implores the intercession of the Blessed Mother. Jesus gave her to the Church as our mother. In their role as priests continuing the ministry of Jesus, we ask Mary to help us as she helped her Son to mature in our faith and ministry. We pray for strength and guidance. We pray for the willingness to follow Jesus and Mary's example to embrace suffering. We pray for the holiness to be about the ministry of the Lord in the priesthood.

My hope is that as we pray this prayer, we will take advantage of this opportunity to be renewed as priests and laity in the ministry of Jesus. May this year be a blessing not only for those of us who have accepted the call to service as priests, but for the whole Church, to treasure the gift of priesthood and join with them in the ministry of the Lord.

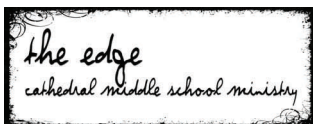

All information will be treated confidentially. Alleged victims are advised of their right to report alleged abuse to civil authorities.

In accordance with diocesan policy, all allegations of sexual misconduct involving children or young people and priests, deacons, lay employees, or volunteers serving the Diocese of Rapid City will be investigated.
