Recommended books: The book Fr Hathaway is currently referencing for his sermons on love of neighbor is The Catechism Explained by Rev. Francis Spirago and edited by Richard Clark, SJ. It contains a *Nihil Obstat* from Arthur J. Scalon and an *Imprimatur* from his Excellency Bishop Patrick Hayes. It rightly bills itself: "A practical manual for use of the preacher, the catechist, the teacher, and the family." Though an old book, first printed 1899, it is filled with perennial truth in very accessible and engaging manner. Available from TAN Books and Publishing, Inc.; ISBN 0-89555-497-6. The other books he mentioned are the 1934 high school text series by Fr. John Laux also re-published by TAN: Chief Truths of the Faith, Mass and the Sacraments, Catholic Morality, Catholic Apologetics, and a book of his which stands alone Introduction to the Bible. The books have the same *Nihil Obstat* and *Imprimatur* as above. All these books will make a fine addition to your library and serve as constant reference material.

ON THE GOSPEL

Beware of false prophets.

The Lord, knowing that there would be false teachers, warns His disciples of the various heresies to come, by saying: *Beware of false prophets.* And as these would not be obvious believers, but persons cloaked with the name of Christian, He did not say: Look well at them, but, *Beware.* For where a thing is certain it is seen; that is, it may readily be seen. But when it is uncertain it is looked at, or watched carefully. And again He says: *Beware:* for to know whom to shun is a firm safeguard of security. He does not warn us to beware as though the devil will introduce heresies against the will of God, and not by His permission. For since He will not choose His servants without trial, He permits them to be tempted. And as He wills that they should not suffer through ignorance He therefore warns them.
