**Recommended books:** The book Fr Hathaway is currently referencing for his sermons on love of neighbor is The Catechism Explained by Rev. Francis Spirago and edited by Richard Clark, SJ. It contains a *Nihil Obstat* from Arthur J. Scalon and an *Imprimatur* from his Excellency Bishop Patrick Hayes. It rightly bills itself: "A practical manual for use of the preacher, the catechist, the teacher, and the family." Though an old book, first printed 1899, it is filled with perennial truth in very accessible and engaging manner. Available from TAN Books and Publishing, Inc.; ISBN 0-89555-497-6. The other books he mentioned are the 1934 high school text series by Fr. John Laux also re-published by TAN: Chief Truths of the Faith, Mass and the Sacraments, Catholic Morality, Catholic Apologetics, and a book of his which stands alone Introduction to the Bible. The books have the same *Nihil Obstat* and *Imprimatur* as above. All these books will make a fine addition to your library and serve as constant reference material.

## ON THE GOSPEL

...that they may receive you into everlasting dwellings.

That is, make the poor your friends, by means of those earthly possessions which the injustice of human greed claims as absolutely belonging to it; lest it be forced to bestow any part of it on the people of God. *Mammon* is a Syriac word for money or riches. *Make unto you therefore, He says, friends, the poor, from the mammon of iniquity; that when they fail, that when you have given your substance for the needs of the poor and spent it all, they may receive you into everlasting dwellings; that is, our friends will obtain our salvation, since they are the same poor in whom Christ the Eternal Rewarder will confess that He has Himself received the kindnesses of our love for our fellow man. The poor themselves do not therefore receive us, but they receive us through Him Who is given to eat in them...*
