Part III – From Generation to Generation: Passing on the Faith

We have all heard that it takes a village to raise a child. This was certainly the case where I was raised in a small rural ranch community where children were often regarded as communal property. The same is also true when it comes to passing the Christian Faith to the next generation. Parents are the first educators of their children, but the rest of the community must assist them in that work.

The National Directory for Catechesis comments, “The effectiveness of catechesis depends to a great extent on the vitality of the Christian community in which it is given” (100). All members of the parish family have a role in ensuring that the faith is lived and practiced well, as catechesis will only be effective in this sort of environment. A community that assumes that the work of the Church is to be done by the pastor and members of his staff is likely to have an ineffective formation program. Likewise, those that assume that only parents need to be involved in catechesis are misinformed. The work of catechesis is the work of the entire community. The National Directory observes that lay catechists “have a special solidarity with those whom they catechize and a particular sensitivity to their needs.” In other words, lay people in a parish understand the experiences and needs of other lay people. Parents who have raised children know the struggles of parents who are raising children. The document also says, “Their proclamation of the Gospel, their personal testimony, and their living witness to the transcendent values of the Christian life can be particularly effective because they know the ordinary experiences

of everyday life so well and are able to incarnate the Gospel in those ordinary circumstances” (229). This statement recognizes that there are times when another person with experiences similar to my own needs to teach my child because my child refuses to hear it from me. My child might be more open with another adult when discussing the difficulties of teen romance than with me. Ordinary people who sit in the pew every Sunday are best equipped to help others learn how Catholicism is lived outside the physical confines of the Church.

The consequence of this is that no one has the liberty to not involve ourselves in the formation of ourselves and others. While we are not all necessarily suited to be catechists for children or adolescents, there is some way in which we are suited to aid the Church in her catechetical mission. Our formation programs are in constant need of cooks, people to stamp and address envelopes, decorators, etc... More to the point, there are many of us who *are* suited to be catechists. If you have already raised children, you probably have a good sense of the needs and difficulties encountered by teenagers, and can help them to resolve these issues in a mature Christian way. If your personality allows you to speak easily to others in a one on one basis, you would be an asset to the catechetical programs at the Cathedral. If you like to talk in front of people, you would also likely be an asset to our formation programs. In the next two weeks, I will offer an explanation of the opportunities that are available to help each of us become better formed and informed in our faith, as well as the means by which we go about forming the youth, and how you are being asked to help.

## PREVALENCE OF CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE

Child sexual abuse is a great deal more prevalent than many imagine. In fact, studies tell us that one in ten adult men and one in five adult women say that they were molested before the age of 18. That means that, directly or indirectly, child sexual abuse will touch most of us during our lifetime. And although we would like to believe that most accusations are false, the facts tell us that children rarely lie about being molested. In fact, they rarely tell anyone at all. An adult study about the prevalence of sexual abuse found that 42 percent of the men and 33 percent of the women who were victimized as children had never told anyone. 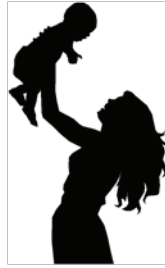
