Annual Picnic today!: Following holy mass, St. Michael's annual picnic will meet at the Storybook Island shelter across from the Sioux San Hospital. All are welcome. **There will be sung vespers** at ICC following the picnic.

A plenary indulgence may be gained by visiting a church on the second day of August and reciting there an Our Father and the Creed (*Portiuncula Indulgence*). (Handbook of Indulgences, Norm #22). The normal conditions apply: Be in the state of grace; be free from attachment to sin; receive Holy Communion; recite prayers for the intention of the holy Father, e.g. a Our Father & a Hail Mary; make a sacramental confession within a week of the prescribed indulgenced work. **Today** we will say an Our Father and the Creed... specific to this indulgence.

Portiuncula was originally a small church in Assisi where St. Francis received his vocation on Feb., 24, 1208. He made it his headquarters for the rest of his life. The town has given name to the Portiuncula Indulgence able to be gained by visiting a church on August 2 or the Sunday after.

ON THE GOSPEL

Entering into the temple he began to cast out them that sold...

That He recounted the evils that were to come, and straightway went into the Temple to cast out those who bought and sold there, makes very evident to us that the destruction of the people was in great measure the fault of priests. For by describing to us the disaster to come, and the scourging those who bought and sold (Jn 2:15) in the Temple, by doing this He shows us from where the disaster had taken root. And we know from another Evangelist, that doves were sold in the temple (Mk 11:15). What does this symbolize but the gift of the Holy Ghost? But He drove from the Temple those who bought and sold there, because He is condemning those who gave the imposition of hands for money, and those who attempt to buy the gift of the Holy Spirit.
