Today, following mass, there will be adoration and benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. We hope you can stay!

Today, there is no vespers at ICC, as Fr Hathaway will offer holy mass at Belle Fourche at 2:30 pm. The class for the Dandelion Pickers is likewise cancelled.

On the third Commandment (to keep holy the Sabbath Day):

ISSUE: Is missing Sunday Mass a mortal sin?

RESPONSE: The requirement to attend Mass on Sunday and other holy days of obligation, rooted in the Third Commandment and codified in Church law (cf. Code of Canon Law, canons 1246-48) is a serious obligation for all Catholics. A Catholic who (a) is able to attend Sunday Mass (i.e., who is not impeded by illness, lack of transportation, etc.), (b) knows the seriousness of this requirement, and (c) nonetheless freely chooses to miss Mass, thereby commits a mortal sin (cf. Catechism, no. 2181).

In his Apostolic Letter *Dies Domini* ("The Day of the Lord"), Pope John Paul II provides profound teaching on the role of the Lord's day in the Christian life. In doing so, the Holy Father provides a historical overview of the Sunday obligation (no. 46), and affirms that the duty to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days "has normally been understood as entailing a grave obligation" (no. 47).
